Patashalas Managed by the Trust

The enduring vision of His Holiness is to transform lives through knowledge. In line with this mission, the Trust supports educational institutions that provide quality education along with holistic development, emphasizing Indian culture, traditions, and values.

All patashalas are residential, offering top-tier contemporary education and life skills in a stress-free, culturally enriched environment.

Vision

To nurture students into culturally grounded, value-driven individuals who uphold dharma and tradition while excelling in their personal and professional lives. Through holistic learning, we aim to shape responsible, compassionate citizens equipped to contribute positively to society.

Mission

To nurture holistic transformation across communities by advancing inclusive education, accessible healthcare, and sustainable rural development; preserving cultural heritage and indigenous wisdom; empowering women and youth through skill-building and leadership; and fostering a deep-rooted connection to our timeless wisdom and values.

Features

Education, food, and accommodation are provided to our students free of charge. Special attention is given to ensure that the meals are nutritious and sattvic, promoting calmness, happiness, and mental clarity. The safety of students on campus is a top priority, with 24/7 security and CCTV surveillance in place.

Classification of Patashalas

The Trust manages 40 patashalas across India and supports 5 additional patashalas through donations and mentoring. These patashalas are categorized into various types: one dedicated solely to Vedic studies and others, known as Integrated patashalas, which combine contemporary education with Vedic learning, culture, and traditions. The third type of Patashalas focus on specialised skill development besides training students in culture, art forms along with modern school education.


Gou Vignyana Patashala

Full-time Veda Patashalas

The full-time Veda Patashalas play a pivotal role in preserving and promoting India's ancient Vedic traditions. These institutions are devoted to the in-depth study of the Vedas and related scriptures, fostering an environment where the timeless wisdom of these texts is passed down through generations. The patashalas emphasize both theoretical and practical mastery of the Vedas, ensuring their accurate recitation, interpretation, and application.

Some Veda Patashalas focus on the study of a specific Veda, such as the Yajur Veda, while others offer a multi-disciplinary approach. For instance: **Single Veda Specialization:** Patashalas focusing on one Veda ensure that students delve deeply into its nuances, including its mantras, hymns, and associated rituals.

Multi-Veda Instruction: Institutions offering training in multiple Vedas, such as the Rig Veda and Yajur Veda, aim to provide a holistic understanding, enabling students to appreciate the interconnectedness of the Vedic texts.



The curriculum in these patashalas is designed to ensure an immersive learning experience. Key aspects include:


1. Vedic Chanting and Pronunciation: Rigorous training in precise recitation techniques, preserving the phonetic purity of the mantras.

2. Hands on Sessions: Practical guidance provided emphasizing their spiritual significance.

3. Ethics and Philosophy: Lessons in the underlying moral and philosophical tenets of Vedic teachings.



There are eight full-time Veda Patashalas, ensuring high standards of education and preserving the authenticity of the teachings. These institutions cater to 125 dedicated students, who live and learn in a traditional gurukula setting. By nurturing the next generation of Vedic scholars, these Patashalas ensure the continuity of India's rich cultural and spiritual heritage.



Integrated Patashalas

Integrated Patashalas for boys offer a unique blend of traditional Vedic education and formal academic education. Alongside their specialization in Vedic scriptures, students are taught subjects like science, social studies, environmental studies, computers, and mass communication, ensuring a well-rounded education. Language learning is also emphasized, with instruction in Sanskrit, English, and various regional languages, equipping students with the skills to engage with both traditional and modern education.

Features

- Students are trained in Vedic scriptures along with fine arts, vocal music, musical instruments, *yoga*, *Ayurveda*, *pooja vidhanam (rituals)*, *shlokas*, *bhajan traditions*, *pravachanam*, *namasankeerthanam*, *agamas*, *vyotisham*, siddha medicine, purohitham, alankaram, acharam, aharam, cooking, Ramayana and more.
- Sharing of wisdom on farming techniques and compassionate practices for cow protection.
- Students attend regular school during the day and learn the specialization pertaining to that Patashala in the mornings and evenings.



Bharateeya Gou Vignyana Patashala

The Gou Vignyana Patashala integrates the traditional study of Gou Vignyana—the ancient science centered on the holistic care, well-being, and significance of cows in dharmic life. Students learn about indigenous breeds, traditional cow-based sciences, sustainable practices, and the cultural importance of Gou Samrakshana. This Patashala aims to preserve spiritual knowledge while nurturing a deep sense of responsibility toward ecological and cultural sustainability. Students attend regular school during the day and study Gou Vignyana in the morning and evening.





Mahaprasada Patashala

The Mahaprasada Patashala brings together Vedic education and the sacred tradition of preparing Prasadam as an offering rooted in purity, devotion, and discipline. Students are trained in Vedic chanting, rituals, and the methods of preparing Naivedyam aligned with Agama Shastra principles. The Patashala helps preserve traditional culinary wisdom, temple food practices, and the spiritual significance of Prasada, enabling students to serve in temple's community centres with devotion and skill.



Sampradaya Patashala for Girls

Sampradaya Patashalas for girls, integrating formal education with cultural training and traditional practices, were conceived and initiated under the directive and guidance of His Holiness.



Vision

- 1 Motivate and empower girls by providing them with suitable tools, methods, and knowledge for comprehensive and inclusive development.
- 2 Protect, preserve, and propagate the principles of Sanatana Dharma along with imparting modern education to girls and young women.
- 3 Offer contemporary education and life skills at no cost to girl students in a culturally rich and supportive environment.

The Sampradaya Patashalas for girls are situated in Tirupati, Pune, Hyderabad, Nashik, Vijayawada, Mehaboob Nagar, and Thiruvanaikoil, with a total strength of 961. To deliver formal academic education

at these centers, the Trust has partnered with the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and the Andhra Pradesh State Board for senior classes. Additionally, girls can pursue higher studies in subjects like Sanskrit at the National Sanskrit University.

All Patashalas offer free education, uniforms, accommodation, and meals. Students are served balanced, nutritious, and sattvic food. Regular medical checkups are conducted to ensure the students' health, and vitamins and food supplements are provided when necessary

To ensure students' safety on campus, round-the-clock security and CCTV surveillance are provided.

Features

- Cultural insights provided through training in music, fine arts, handicrafts, and yoga.
- Traditional practices taught through training on pooja vidhanam, celebration of festivals, and visits to temples.
- Workshops for personality development, communication skills, and experiential learning are conducted by professional experts.
- Traditional cooking and making of naivedhyam (offering to God) is taught to students as part of the curriculum. A kitchen has been set up as a lab for practical training.
- Spiritual growth is encouraged through chanting of shlokas, bhajans, and pravachanams; and by reading scriptures like the Bhagavad Gita.

Students are provided with laptops or smartphones by the Trust to ensure uninterrupted education, as needed.

The Trust also offers full financial support for the treatment of any student with health issues at the Patashalas. Periodic medical camps, including eye check-ups through the Ophthalmology wing of Shankara Hospitals, Chennai, are organized for the students.





Sampradaya – Shastra Sarani

Sampradaya – Shastra Sarani, launched in Kanchipuram with just six girls, has grown to support over 135 students, empowering them with cultural values besides providing them full time college education along with applicable scholarships. Focused on students from economically weaker sections, they are provided education along with choosing a course of their choice. Students are from semi-urban and rural areas, many of whom are first-generation learners and children of farmers, temple priests, workers, or unemployed parents, the initiative bridges the gap in access to professional courses caused by financial constraints and lack of exposure. By offering personalized career counseling and scholarships, Shastra Sarani ensures these young women can pursue their chosen educational paths. Rooted in the belief that healthy family units create a strong nation, the program is committed to developing resilient, courageous, and steadfast women leaders who, through intelligence and righteousness, can transform families and organizations alike.



Our Vision



To create empowered women by focusing on health & hygiene, providing the right education and training in best practices for holistic development, physical and mental well being.

Our Curriculum

Our holistic approach to the development of an empowered woman has 3 dimensions. The first is “Dinacharya”, second the study of scriptures and learning of shlokas and the third being skill development.

Dinacharya

Physical and mental wellbeing is the most critical aspect of unleashing the human potential. Girls practice the traditional Indian lifestyle in food, sleep and hygiene practices on a daily basis. Their daily food routine comprises of Saatvik food, fresh fruits and nuts, cow’s milk and ghee. Girls start their day at 5 AM and do yoga. They are then engaged in activities like drawing kolams, doing surya namaskaram, decorating the tulsi plant and performing puja, lighting lamp, chanting shlokas before they get ready to go to college.

Study of Indian Ethos

Girls study scriptures like Ramayana, Mahabharatha, Bhagavad Gita, Neethi Shathakam to understand the moral values and greatness of Indian women. Adi Shankarar’s shlokas, Ayurveda, Jyotisham and Sanskrit are some of the many things the girls learn during their course of study here. Study of scriptures enable one to build a strong and moral character that serves as a strong foundation to one’s life.

Skill Development

Girls are provided training in fine arts, culinary and technical skills. Short and long term courses on Carnatic music, veena, violin, sewing, arts & crafts, temple architecture, cooking traditional food and savories, spoken English, personality development, Microsoft office, Tally, coding, etc are conducted to ensure girls are well equipped with all knowledge and skills required for their successful personal and professional lives.



Weekend Sampradaya Classes

Currently, Sampradaya classes for boys and girls are held on weekends, primarily for students who are unable to attend residential schools. These classes aim to familiarize the next generation with rich traditional values and instill a lasting interest in following foundational Dharmic practices regularly. Sampradaya classes are conducted online.

Sri Kamakshi Srividhya Samithi

Sri Kamakshi Srividhya Samithi (SKSVS), a wing of Sri Pratyaksha Charitable Trust, promotes dharmic and cultural values among Kanyas, Kumaris, and women through the traditional Guru–Shishya system. With the blessings of Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam, SKSVS offers structured learning, sampradaya sessions, and workshops that help balance modern living with spiritual discipline and timeless traditions.



Nadaswara Patashalas

Nadaswara Patashala was established with the aim of preserving and passing on this traditional art form to the present generation. There are two Nadaswara institutes, one for boys and one for girls, located in Karvetinagaram. In addition, there are two more patashalas at Bangalore and Mukkamala, AP. Receiving Nadaswara training, students at this Patashala also attend the Government School for their regular education. Students are also trained in education on nursing care, for their all-round development, a form of herbal medicine. Girl students receive instruction in tailoring, arts, crafts, and nursing care to help secure their future.

There are total of 4 Nadaswara Patashalas with 262 students.







Kummhari Integrated Patashalas

A new Patashala was started in 2024 with specialization in Pottery making. Currently 14 students are studying in the Patashala. Sustainable eco friendly materials are used to make these pots and hands on skills training is provided. This patashala is one of the first of its kind. The students attend regular school during the day.



Supported Patashalas

The Trust also supports 5 Patashalas by providing financial support and mentoring. These Patashalas are situated in Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. A total of **85** students are benefiting from the comprehensive education provided at these institutions.



Shri Shankara Vijayendra Saraswathi Ramayana Patashala

The Shankara Vijayendra Saraswathi–Ramayana Patashala stands as a unique educational institution dedicated to holistic learning, blending India’s rich cultural heritage with modern education. Governed by the Sri Pratyaksha Charitable Trust, the Patashala emphasizes the teachings of the Ramayana – the great Itihasa (history) of our Bharata Varsha. There is no aspect of Dharma that is not illustrated in the Ramayana. This pathashala offers a CBSE–based curriculum in a fully residential environment.





Akhila Bharatha Agnihotra Sadas

Vedas are the fountainhead of knowledge. The Veda Mantras pray for the welfare of the entire creation and hence the chanting of Vedas and performance of practises therein benefits one & all. The Agnihotra is one such practise prescribed by the Vedas. The Vedic scholar has to undergo exhaustive Vedic study for a decade, follow high discipline to become eligible Agnihotris and this qualifies him to further perform Yagnyas & Ishtis which are for welfare of one & all.

Pujyasri Jagadguru Shankaracharya Swamigal blesses & honours this ancient tradition by holding special sessions on Agnihotra & Shrouta Practices with an objective to dispel doubts, exchange & enhancement of knowledge and expanding the upholders of this unique tradition by required patronage. SPCT supports this scholarly initiative known as Agnihotra Sadas by providing necessary facilities for scholars and participants.

The 21st year of the Akhila Bharatha Agnihotri Sadas was conducted during the Chaturmasya Vratam of His Holiness at Tirupati between 30 July and 2 August 2025.

The main features of the Sadas included:

- Vakyartam of Srautha Grantas
- Ayutha Sankya Navagraha Shanti Homam
- Laksha Sankya Brihaspati Shanti Homam
- Ishti Yagnams performed by the Nitya Agnihotris for world peace and Bharata Desha Kshemam, supporting progress and victory over all hurdles of development.

Agnihotris from the states of Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Goa, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala — a total of 132 participants — took part in the Sadas.

The grand event concluded in the presence of Sri Nithin Gadkari ji, Honourable Central Minister, with prayers for universal peace and the nation's prosperity.

The Agnihotris were honoured and blessed by His Holiness of Sri Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam, who graced the Poornahuti every day and offered honorariums of gold, silver, vastrams, shawls, and sambhavana on the concluding day.





Support to Vedic Higher Learning

The Vedas outline how individuals can regulate their lives systematically to make them purposeful, peaceful, and blissful. They encourage everyone to engage in Karma (actions) for personal spiritual well-being and the greater good of society. According to the Vedas, Dharma promotes both individual and societal welfare.

To underscore the importance of expanding knowledge of the Vedas and Shastras, and to disseminate this wisdom among the public while fostering interest, discourses are conducted in various locations by scholars.

The Sabha organizes:

- 1 Vidvat Sadas
- 2 Veda Sammelanams
- 3 Vishesha Upanyasams
- 4 Dharma Shastra Sadas

The trust supports Vedic higher learning after a student completes his eight years basic Vedic education. The patashala in Sulaimeni near Thandalam village was opened this year. This Patashala will focus on teaching Sastras to its resident students.




Scholarship Programs


Vishwavidya Scholarship Scheme

Initiated in August 2020 under the blessings of His Holiness, the Vishwavidya Scholarship represents the Trust’s flagship program to promote education and knowledge for all. This initiative supports meritorious students from diverse fields – including engineering, medicine, arts, commerce, and traditional studies – covering tuition fees, examinations, and academic expenses. With the guidance of His Holiness and the contribution of corporate and individual donors, the scheme has processed 1000+ applications and disbursed over ₹5 Cr, empowering students to pursue higher education and contribute meaningfully to society.



Nadaswara Pathashala students now pursuing higher education in Nursing college with funding through Vishwavidya scholarship program



Vishwavidya Scholarship Distribution

Pension Program for Senior Vedic Scholars

The Trust operates a Pension Program for Vedic scholars across India to honor their contributions to the study of ancient scriptures. The objectives of this program are to:

- Support the scholars in their old age.
- Recognize their efforts in preserving and promoting the ancient body of Indian scriptures.

This program benefits several Vedic scholars from rural areas who have devoted their lives to teaching the Vedas and ancient scriptures.





Social Activities

The Trust invests in social capital by fostering activities such as cow protection, rural development programs, infrastructure support, healthcare initiatives, and relief work during natural calamities. These efforts aim to enhance community effectiveness through shared identity, norms, values, and networks of relationships.

Gou Samrakshanam (Cow Protection)

The Trust supports and maintains over 2,000 cows in goshalas (cow sheds/shelters) located in Amarkantak, Madhya Pradesh, and in Sulaimeni, Gummidipoondi, and Thandalam in Tamil Nadu. The Trust also cares for sick, injured, and handicapped cows.

Additionally, the Trust has provided cow mats to the goshalas, offering a comfortable base for the cattle while lying down or standing. These mats have not only enhanced the comfort of the animals but have also prevented joint degeneration and heel diseases like foot rot, thereby improving their overall health.

The New Kamakoti Gosala is being developed at Vedal, Kanchipuram, Tamil Nadu, along the Madras-Bangalore Highway. The Gosala is dedicated to the care and protection of cows, which are revered as the mothers of all beings, bringing happiness and prosperity to society.





Rural Development Program and Infrastructure Support

The Trust has launched various schemes aimed at the overall development of rural areas. Initially, the Trust has identified and upgraded schools in villages and towns, providing meals and sweets to children on special occasions.

Additionally, the Trust has constructed public utility centers, public libraries, and Satsang halls for spiritual discourses, among other facilities.



Green Cover

The Trust has been actively working to enhance green cover. As part of this initiative, it has planted saplings in the Tiruvallur district of Tamil Nadu. Additionally, a Nakshatra Vana (Garden of native plant species) is maintained to protect and preserve both native and exotic flora.

A borewell has also been drilled at Amarkantak in Madhya Pradesh to address water shortages.

Special Programs for Northeast India and Jammu & Kashmir

The Trust plays a crucial role in supporting various initiatives and programs that foster peace and development in North-East India and the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir. An annual Viswashanthi yagam is conducted in Srinagar for the welfare of all living beings on Earth. These social and cultural events contribute to uniting people from different states and walks of life.

The Trust also operates a full-time Veda Patashala in Ranipool, about 12 km from Sikkim's capital, Gangtok, in Northeast India. Students from Bihar, Assam, and the neighboring country of Nepal receive teachings in the Vedas and other scriptures at this Patashala. Established in 2013, it aims to promote peace and increase awareness among young people about our rich culture and traditions.



Annadhanam

“Annād bhavanti bhūtāni (all creation is sustained due to food)”, says Lord Krishna in the Bhagavad Gita. Our sacred Hindu scriptures (shastras) declare that annadhanam (feeding the poor) is the greatest virtue. Among the Trust's ongoing initiatives is providing food to those in need, especially in rural areas. Each year, on the occasion of Adi Shankaracharya's Jayanthi, the Trust organizes Annadhanam Camps in various towns and villages to serve food to the less fortunate.

Assistance in Performing Marriages

The Trust provides financial assistance and supplies essential wedding items, including the tirumangalyam, to families from economically weaker sections. This support is aimed at helping them conduct marriages, particularly for girls.



Agri Seeds Distribution – Rishi Krishi


The Trust distributed seeds to farmers from economically weaker rural communities to aid in food production and support their livelihoods. AGRI SEEDS DHANAM was given to farmers in Ayyuragaram village near Villupuram this year, marking the fourth batch of beneficiaries. This initiative falls under the Trust's Rishi Krishi program aimed at empowering farmers.



Provisions and Clothing Distribution

The trust initiates drive and provides raw material required to make basic food, sweets, savouries during festivals to the needy people. 300 families have benefitted by this distribution.

The Trust also extends its support by providing basic clothing to underprivileged sections of society, ensuring their essential needs are met.



Financial Support for Final Rites

The Trust also extends financial assistance to those in need to help cover the costs of performing the last rites for their loved ones.

Healthcare Initiatives

The Trust organizes health camps for elderly citizens and for students and their families from economically disadvantaged sections of society.

Regular health check-ups are provided to the families of students supported by the Trust, as well as to senior citizens in vrudhashrams (old-age homes).

In addition, the Trust offers financial assistance to individuals from economically weaker backgrounds to cover medical treatments and the cost of medicines.



Sri Kanchi Matam Urban Health Centre - Tirupati Free Hospital

- An OPD unit was inaugurated in July 2021 amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Initially, it focused on general patients, and later expanded to include Dental and Ophthalmology services.
- SKMUHC primarily serves the underprivileged community, providing completely free services, including doctor consultations and medications for two days. Additional follow-up services are available as needed.
- Our Dental and Eye departments are equipped for basic check-ups and treatments. Patients requiring advanced or specialized care are referred to external clinics.
- To date this year, 30,466 patients have received free treatment.

Milestones

- The OPD license was granted by the State Health Department authority for a five-year period starting September 2022.
- Ayurvedic medicine has been introduced as an alternative option for those who prefer it.
- We have partnered with Aravind Eye Care to provide cataract surgeries for the needy at no or minimal cost, based on our recommendations and subject to certain conditions.
- We have also collaborated with Thyrocare to offer thyroid testing for patients at a very minimal cost.





Art and Cultural Activities



The Trust has consistently been at the forefront of fostering national integration by promoting and preserving India's rich music and cultural traditions. To this end, it has undertaken various initiatives, such as celebrating Jayantis, preserving ancient texts, renovating heritage structures, and maintaining temples, buildings, and satsang halls. Additionally, the patashalas and schools managed by the Trust offer students an in-depth education in and appreciation of, India's diverse art forms, culture, and heritage.

Promoting Indian Music, Tradition and Culture

To preserve India's rich musical heritage, the Trust has established Nadaswara Patashalas (instrumental music schools) for both boys and girls, where students learn this traditional art form alongside their regular education and training in Nattu Vaidhyam (traditional medicine).

The Kamakoti Triveni Sangeetha Patashala in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, was founded with the mission to safeguard and promote the value of music education for future generations.

In addition to sponsoring special classical music concerts, the Trust offers financial support to children from traditional Nadaswaram families to ensure the continuation of this revered art. It also organizes cultural training camps to impart the rich principles of Indian culture through various educational events.


Maintaining and Preserving Indian Heritage Structures

The Trust has undertaken numerous initiatives to renovate temples and restore heritage structures, such as traditional Indian homes and mandaps (halls used for community activities and Vedic propagation), along with century-old buildings. Notably, two such buildings in Mayavaram and Mahendramangalam,

Tamil Nadu, have been restored to their original grandeur.

In addition, the Trust maintains Vedic and cultural centers at Arani (Tamil Nadu), Machilipatnam (Andhra Pradesh), and Amarkantak (Madhya Pradesh), where Veda Parayanam, daily poojas, pravachanams, and annadhanam are regularly conducted.

With support from several philanthropists, the Trust is constructing the 'Shankara National Integration Centre' in Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Islands. This center aims to promote national integration while preserving and propagating Indian culture and tradition.





Preserving Ancient Texts

The Trust is actively engaged in preserving ancient scriptures, palm leaf manuscripts, and rare books. To achieve this, it has established a digital library in Chennai, where scholars work to organize, archive, and disseminate the timeless wisdom contained in these ancient texts. In addition to preservation efforts, the Trust is involved in printing and publishing books and producing videos that highlight India's rich culture, heritage, and traditions.



Jayanthi Celebrations

Jayanthi (birth anniversary) of the revered philosopher Jagdguru Adi Shankara Bhagavathpada, who championed Advaita Vedanta and the cause of advaita to foster unity and harmony, is celebrated all across India.

Under the gracious guidance of Pujyasri Acharyas, Shankara Jayanthi has been celebrated annually at Shankaracharya Hill in Kashmir since 2012. Each year's celebration is uniquely crafted by different Veda shakhas (branches). The mahotsavam (grand festival) features a range of activities, including homam, pravachanam, shlokas, and musical performances, with participation from numerous Veda pandits and devotees who receive blessings from the Acharyas.

Additionally, the celebrations of his Holiness Jayanthi, Guru Pournima, and other festivals are carried out with great enthusiasm at various cultural centers and Patashalas.

Temple tank

A temple tank was renovated and dedicated to the public in Thandalam Village. The tank recharges groundwater, supports biodiversity, and serves as a reservoir during droughts. There is a pathway built around the tank for walkers to spend time with nature and help with their well-being.





Deva Puja Welfare Scheme



There is an old adage which asks one to reside in the vicinity of a temple, since temples are not only the abode of the divinity but are a centre for cultural excellence, social harmony and traditional knowledge. Environmental protection through temple tanks, gardens and cow shed is ensured in the temples. Temples generate positive energy, instill divine feelings and soothe the minds and hearts of the devotee. Hence our sages, kings and our ancestors established these divine abodes. There are specific procedures which mention the routine worship and special occasions to be observed and method for upkeep of temple.

Pujaris, or the priests who officiate the temples play a pivotal role in its day to day running of this divine heritage. They devote their entire lives to the deity, the temple, and the society beginning their day before sunrise with Nitya Pujas and Sevas, and continuing until the temple closes in the late evening. Their duties include performing various rituals such as Abhishekam, Archana, Neivedhyam, and Deeparadhana at specific times, along with special Pujas on auspicious days like Ekadashi, Pradosham, Pournami, and Fridays, as guided by the Panchanga. In addition to these daily rituals, Pujaris conduct Pakshotsavams (fortnightly), Maasotsavams (monthly), and Samvatsarotsavams (annually, aka Brahmotsavams). They are also responsible for the upkeep and safety of the Lord's Vastras, Abharanas, Vahanas, and other sacred items.

The Trust has taken upon itself the onerous responsibility to support deserving pujaris especially living in rural areas recognizing their commitment to dharma and society. As a beginning the trust is concentrating in God's own country Kerala in implementing this welfare scheme.

- A monthly grant is given to each beneficiary under this scheme to encourage them to serve the temples, and contribute to its divinity and spirituality, resulting in overall grace and being supported at present

- Currently more than 251 Pujaris in temples from remote villages are being supported with contributions from philanthropists.
- Additionally, we plan to increase coverage to 1000 Pujaris in the next 2 years.



Objective

- The initiative aims to support meritorious and deserving archakas (priests) from rural areas across six Indian states, who are not receiving financial aid from any other organization.
- Priests from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Pondicherry, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana are beneficiaries under this program.
- The scheme is designed to assist archakas with low incomes, providing them with essential financial support to improve their livelihoods.

Learning:

Sri Shankara Advaita Research Center facilitates research on various aspects of Vedas, Vedangas, and Upanishads, and houses an extensive library.



Podili is located 50 KMs to the west of Ongole, on Srisailam route. It is well connected through public transportation by Rail and Road.

Living:

A fully equipped Sri Shankara Hostel provides accommodation for Vedic students and Adhyapakas (teachers), with a kitchen and dining facility adhering to Vedic standards and modern utilities. Each room accommodates three students, with a total capacity of more than 100. Classrooms for Vedic teaching are named after the Sapta Rishis, and the halls, auditoriums, and exam rooms are named after great Indian saints. Additionally, there is a guest house for visiting Vedic scholars and faculty.

Sri Jayendra Saraswathi Health Center offers outpatient services to the local population and healthcare for students in the project complex.

Yoga Center: A dedicated space for yoga practice, along with an indoor sports room for recreational indoor games.


In Varanasi a similar infrastructure is being developed at Gadauli Dham, UP. Currently an integrated Veda patashala and Ghosala is operating from that facility.






Summary of Expenses 2024 - 2025




